Delivered Compost

There are still some bags of compost for sale @£2.75 per bag. Contact one of the committee to arrange.

All monies go to the Communal Allotment fund.

Communal Composting area

The communal composting bays will be opened on specific days which will advertised on the allotment notice board (on these days you will also be able to take compost from the bays (which is free)

Horse Manure

A delivery of fresh horse manure is arriving this week and will be available on Sunday 7th October at the same time as the composting bays are open. £1 per barrow. Suitable for adding to compost or spreading on empty beds to rot down over the winter.

Sweetcorn and Squirrels

Many people have lost their sweetcorn to the pesky squirrels this year. A couple of suggestions are to place cut out plastic milk bottles—over the maturing cobs and another to wipe vic around the base of the stem.



What to do on your allotment this Autumn:

Apart from tidying away and composting the faded leaves and stems and generally tidying up, there are many things you can do to make your garden productive over the winter and prepare for Spring.

Seeds

There are still seeds to put in the ground for winter growing such as

Pak choy, Mizuna and Rocket Spring onion White Lisbon Lettuce Winter Cos, Winter Crop and Arctic King

If you have uncultivated areas consider planting green manures otherwise cover with polythene sheets or tarpaulins to suppress weed growth and prevent the leaching of nutrients from soil.

Fruit

Grease band fruit trees to combat winter moth and ants.

Finish pruning early fruiting raspberries (that fruit on last year's stems), tie in new stems for next year's fruit.

Late fruiting raspberries (those that fruit on this year's stems) can be cut down to the ground later in the winter.

Herbs

Collect and freeze annual herbs.

Vegetables

To avoid slug damage dig up and store potatoes in a cool, dry and dark place.

Check for brassica whitefly. Remove any infested lower leaves. Spray with insecticidal soap if infestation is heavy.

Compost

Keep adding to your compost bins. If you run out of space or have slower composting material bring it to the communal composting area when open (see dates on notice board) or arrange a convenient time with a member of the committee.

Recipes:

Sarah Blackmore's Beetroot Cake



Sarah's husband is a beetroot farmer in Devon

Serves 8-10

450g SR white flour 1tsp round nutmeg 1tsp mixed spice light brown sugar 275g 125g chopped walnuts 350g cooked beetroot grated 2 ripe bananas mashed 4 medium eggs 300ml sunflower oil Cocoa or melted chocolate can be added to make a yummy

Icing (Optional)

225g half fat cream cheese

chocolate version.

85g icing sugar 2tsp lemon juice

Sift the flour and spices. Stir in the sugar,nuts,beetroot and bananas. Make a well in the flour and add eggs and oil and beat until incorporated. Put into an 8in deep sided cake tin and bake for 1 hour or until an inserted skewer comes out cleanly.

To make the icing beat together the cheese, sugar and lemon juice till smooth.

Decorate the cake with the icing and enjoy!
